I. General Announcements

II. Whitewater Park Boulevard Roundabout Sculpture

• Water Chute sculpture has been installed. Roundabout will be completed in the next few weeks.

III. Fairview Park Grant Announcement (Kathleen Lacey)

- Mayor David Bieter announced last Friday the award of \$487k of neighborhood reinvestment grants across the city. VPNA applied for a reinvestment grand and was awarded money for a Biggo Duo Swing and electricity. The swing will be installed in Fairview Park summer 2016. IV. Esther Simplot Park (Wendy Larimore)

- The park's buildings have been completed. The playgrounds are mostly completed. The
 islands are completed. Top soil is being installed and plant material will be installed by
 the end of June. The City is hoping vegetation will be established by the end of the
 summer; this will be required before the park can be opened to the public. There will be
 a dog off leash area, but it will require a leash to get there from the parking lot.

- The greenbelt on the north side of the Boise River will remain closed until Simplot Park is opened. Wendy anticipates that the Greenbelt spur from Whitewater Park Boulevard/Pleasanton to the Whitewater Park will be opened by the end of May.
- The Albertson's Foundation has provided funding for the 2nd phase of the Whitewater Park. The 2nd phase will include main beach access, 3 drop structures, and a stream into Veteran's Pond. There will not be any adjustable waves in the 2nd phase.
- Neighbors are concerned about traffic and parking in the Veteran's Park East subneighborhood and would like signage informing visitors that there is no access to the park from those streets. Residents can inquire about sign requests with ADHD.

V. West End Development (Jay Story)

- The City of Boise has completed a property exchange with Local Construct. Local Construct has obtained land bordered by Fairview, Main, Whitewater Park Boulevard and 28th street.
- The city has requirements for the development of the area including residential (including income-based housing) and commercial uses as well as an extension of 29th street through the property and Public East-West pedestrian walkways.

VI. Ready for 100% Boise (Casey Mattoon)

VII. State Street/ Veterans Memorial Parkway/36th Street Intersection Redesign (Joe Tate)

- ACHD has finished the Design Phase of the project and is now in the Right-of-Way Acquisition Phase. The intersection will utilize a ThruU-Turn concept. There will be 3 pedestrian crossings.
- There will be a project going in this summer to install a pedestrian crossing by the end of August 2016.
