IV. Grant Applications

Notes:

- o Bike Repair Station
 - Potential Locations include Simplot Park side of the 36th Street Bridge,
 Willow Lane Park at the End of Lander Street intersection with Greenbelt
- Green Bike Station
 - Potential future locations might include Simplot Park, Veterans Park,
 Willow Lane Park, and the College of Western Idaho campus.
 - We need to find out if there is a master plan for the Green Bike Stations
- Art Panels at Whittier
 - There are not enough panels to complete the fencing.
 - A new grant would be needed to obtain further panels
 - Whittier wants playground equipment; slides are cracking and have had to be closed off.
 - Whittier is one of the top 5 schools in the Boise School District that is being considered for expansion or rebuild. The school may be raised or turned into a community center.
 - Whittier School Garden would like to obtain a Garden Shed

Action Steps:

- Brian C to work with PTO at Whittier to apply for a grant for playground equipment and mini-grant for a garden shed
- Rae/Brian C. will go on October 5 if she is in town to the Grant Application Meeting
- Rae will check in the Boise Green Bike and identify how new VPNA stations will fit in with the plan
- Mel will meet with Taft school to identify any needs that might fit within the grant application process.
- o Tyler will begin process of application for bike repair stations.
